COMMITTEE DOINGS

FROM YOUR HOUSE COMMITTEE

As we are heading to the end of our 2nd Quarter of the Lodge year 2011/2012, it is nice to be able to report that in the year to date period of April through August we exceeded Budget. Actual sales were P 5,880,128 versus budget of P 5,397,256 or 109%, total net income was P 253,698 profit versus budget of P102,657 or 247%.

We have been interviewing different Club Managers, and it looks like we have found a good candidate. It was approved on the Lodge floor to offer him a three year contract. The contract will be put together and reviewed by our Labor people before submission. Fritz Weber completed his two month assignment and now we have a new menu that will be put out as soon as we have the new covers, hopefully in a couple weeks. In addition he gave us some good procedure write-ups as well as job descriptions that can be turned over to the new Manager.

The Security System has been installed and is ready to be used as soon as we get enough cards for all Members. The additional cards will be in the next shipment coming in the next few weeks. The new POS System has been installed and we are still ongoing with debugging efforts. We may have to look at some alternatives in the area and it is being addressed between the IT Committee and the House Committee.

On Air Quality we have put the additional fans in and have rerouted the ducting through the kitchen exhaust system. Although the system is working pretty well, we still may have to increase the part going from the bar to the kitchen as the space we had to work with was inadequate.

We received the approval from the Trustee's and Lodge to put in the Fire Suppression System which will cost us P 135,000. This is required by the Makati Fire Department ordinance and is required before we can obtain our smoking permit.

The House Committee is here to serve the Members, if anyone has any suggestions for improvements please let us know. The other Members are, Jeff Green, Tim Strong, Reinor Gloor, and Tom Jordan.

ENF Scholarships Available to Manila Elks Members

If you have a high school senior student in your family who plans to attend college, he or she may qualify for an ENF Scholarship! Contact an ENF Committee member or the Elks National ENF at <u>scholarship@elks.org</u> for more details if, after reading the following section, you believe your student may be eligible.

Who is Eligible?

Any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2009, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2009, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2012. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.

The applicant must be a high school senior.

The applicant must apply online only.

If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.

Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student qualifies for more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value.

Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities. (Note: Applicants from Guam, Panama, Puerto Rico and the Philippines may apply Legacy Awards toward schools, colleges or universities in their respective homes.)

Patriots' Day 9/11 Ceremony at the Elks

An Inspiring Event to Make Us Proud

The Patriots' Day 9/11 Ceremony was, by all accounts, an overwhelming success. This event, which began as a dream, with no budget, eventually turned out to be one of the largest and most well attended events in Elks Lodge 761 history. In fact, the Elks Patriots Day Ceremony was the premiere American event in the Philippines.

The event, with a full house, commenced with a luncheon and was followed by a solemn Ceremony. The program, full of many emotion-evoking videos of the attack on America and patriotic music videos, attracted many dignitaries. Key note addresses were delivered by US Ambassador Harry Thomas, Jr., as well as former Philippine President Fidel Ramos and General Ismael Villareal, former vice chair of the Armed Forces of the Philippines. Also speaking at the Ceremony were British Ambassador Stephen Lillie, Canadian Ambassador Christopher Thornley, Australian Ambassador Roderick Smith, as well as Minister Motohiko Kato from the Japanese Embassy and Counselor Kim Kiejoo from the South Korean Embassy.

During the Ceremony, ER Doyle Stout remarked about the history of the Elks, and reminded the audience of why we were there – to remember all those who perished in the 9/II national tragedy. He then called for the unveiling of the Elks 9/11 Diorama. It attracted the attention of all present, and the press gathered quickly around it to take photographs. The Diorama, which was funded by pledges, is available for viewing at the Club. Make sure you see it, as it is quite dramatic.

Although the event was un-budgeted, a pledge campaign was initiated by the Committee to fund the Elks 9/11 Diorama. But, as pledges grew they were used to fund the entire luncheon and ceremony. In total, pledges were 317,500php, from 45 Elks Club and Lodge members. The Committee decided to provide donor envelopes at each seat, seeking contributions from the guests. Total proceed from these donations were 12,370php. Thus, the net proceeds from pledges and donations for 9/11 event were 329,870php. Thank you to all who gave so generously. In preparation for the Ceremony, the Club was spruced up. General cleaning and painting were done. And, through the generous pledges and donations, a new public address system was installed with new speakers, along with new napkins and new wine glasses. The air conditioning units were inspected and repaired. Because of the costs of these items, the House Committee volunteered to pay some of these expenses, and received Lodge approval to do so. And, you will note that new shades have been installed in the Colonial, thanks to the House Committee, Trustees and the Lodge. Thanks to the generosity of James DuVivier and Larry Thomas, the wine for the event was donated, saving the 9/11 Committee that expense.

The Patriots' Day Committee agreed to use pledges to fund the cost of video production of the event, and preparation of 200 DVD copies for ENF. These DVDs of the entire event will be available for sale at the Club for 800php, with all proceeds going to ENF. For those who missed the event, this is your opportunity to see the program, and share what attendees experienced. To order, contact the Club Reception.

The media was well represented at the Patriots' Day Ceremony. Included in those providing coverage was Fox News, The Associated Press, Reuters, ABS-CBN TV, GMA7 TV, Channel 4, IBC and several from the foreign press. Much of this was coordinated by Mr. Michael Cohen from Fox News. Press Kits were prepared and distributed to the media. Coverage of the event was carried on local television stations, with some coverage by Fox and Sky. And, the kitchen staff did a commendable job in preparing quality plated-meals for such a large group. Food taste was wonderful, and it was hot and appetizing when served.

The wait staff and the bar staff service was exemplary and they deserve both credit and recognition for their excellent work. The Administrative staff worked behind the scenes, and did whatever was asked of them. They were always available to lend a helping hand. The entire staff did a wonderful job, and the Elks owe them the highest praise.

But, the real forces behind the event success were Jen Acuna and Vennie Tesalona. They both were devoted and committed. Jen, while performing her regular job, spent countless hours for the event, even while on vacation. She oversaw all the marketing aspects and many other elements of the program planning.
